ECHO GAM: ASSESSMENT

- Qualitative Surveys on GAM and Trainings;
- Analysis of quantitative data;
- Random check on proposals/reports;
- Interviews or meetings with partners and ECHO operation staff (both at field and HQ level);



MAIN FINDINGS

NB: BEING THE FIRST YEAR OF IMPLEMENTATION OF THE ECHO GENDER & AGE MARKER, THESE FINDINGS SERVE AS A BASELINE. ASSESSMENTS WILL BE CONDUCTED ON A YEARLY BASIS.

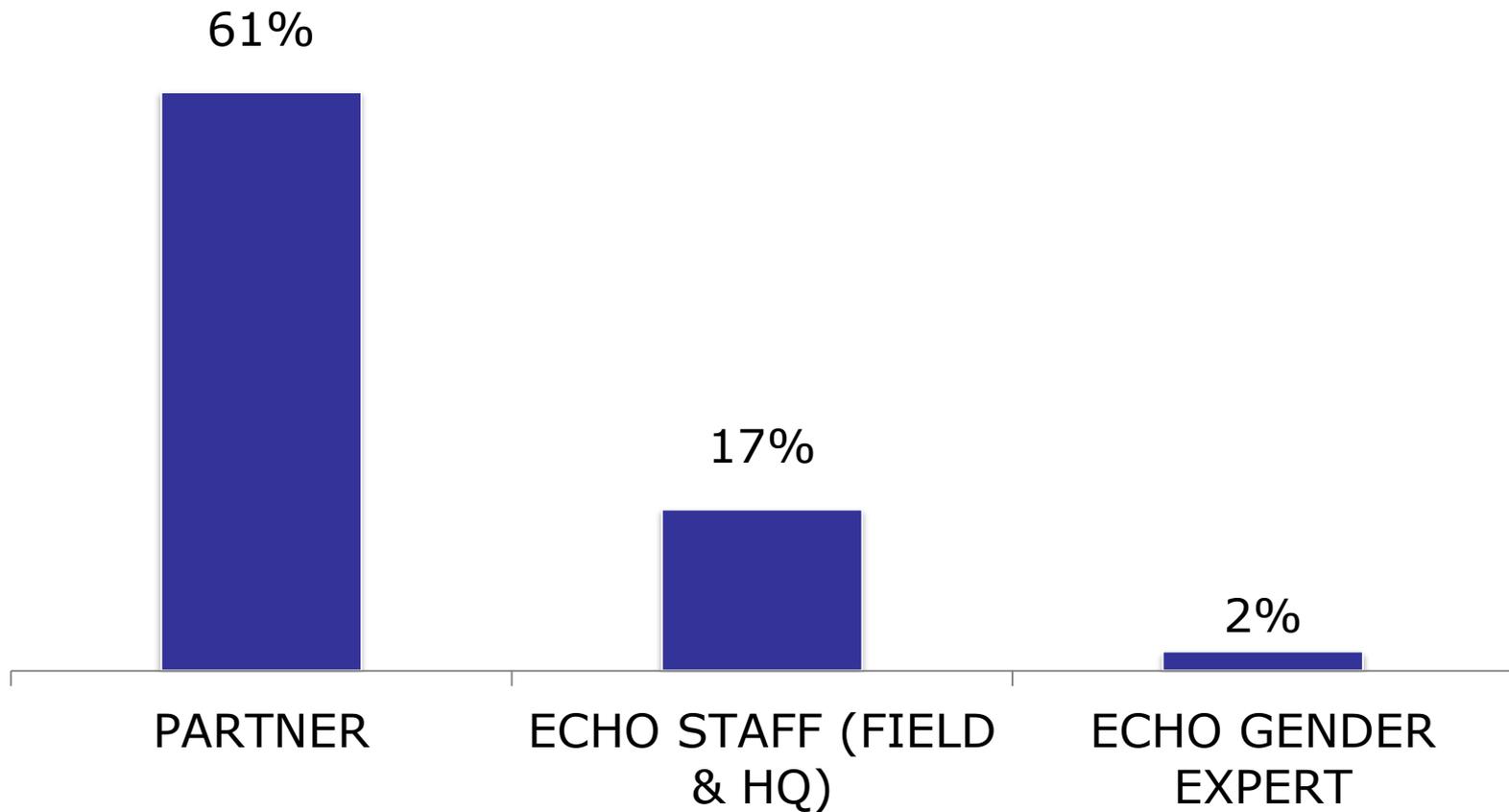
- 56% of respondents from partner organizations believe that the introduction of GAM has fostered change/positive actions to enhance gender and age mainstreaming (while 37% replied somewhat);
- Gender analysis has been identified by the majority of respondents as the least difficult, while negative effects as the most difficult criterion to be taken into consideration



MAIN FINDINGS (*cont.*)

- More than half of assessed proposals (where applicable/when information available) haven't been marked on the basis of toolkit's instructions by both partners and ECHO staff;
- Discussions between ECHO staff and partners needs to be enhanced: 46% of respondents from partner organizations think that feedback are discontinuous/only at one phase of project and 21% have not received a feedback
